1 Submission of an article

Articles and letters to the editors should be submitted by email to Arnaud Deraemaeker (Arnaud.Deraemaeker@ulb.be)

2 Copyright notice

Before submission, authors should check compliance with the items below :

- The authors retain the copyright for their submission, and grant the journal the right of first publication of the article
- The authors are encouraged to deposit a pre-print version of their paper in an archive such as arXiv (<https://arxiv.org>) or HAL (<https://hal.archives-ouvertes.fr/>). They are also encouraged to share their scripts and experimental results using a permanent doi, for example in Zenodo (<https://www.zenodo.org>).
- The authors are entitled and accept responsibility for submitting an article on behalf of any and all co-authors
- The article, if accepted, will be published under a CC-BY licence, without any financial compensation (see <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/3.0/>)
- Permission has been obtained from the copyright holder of all material in the submission (figures, tables, ...)

3 Manuscript preparation

The manuscript should be prepared using the provided latex template, using the review format, and submitted in the pdf format. It should be accompanied by a letter to the editors of maximum 2 pages where the authors:

- briefly explain the context and relevance of their research work
- explain how the work is novel compared to the state-of-the-art including recent publications in the field. If the article is a review of a certain field, explain why the review is timely, unique and insightful.
- explain the added value of the method/experiments presented compared to the existing techniques, and for which particular applications they are useful.

The letter to the editors should be written using the provided latex template and submitted in the pdf format.

Poor English quality and/or numerous typographical errors in both the manuscript and the letter to the editors will lead to rejection of the paper before the peer-review process. All submitted papers will be checked for plagiarism.

Where authors wish to use Microsoft Word rather than latex to produce the pdf of the manuscript, guideline docx files created from the latex template are provided giving indications on required font, margin, etc.
